# 1st Annual CRISM Prairie Node meeting

Save the date - June 23 and 24, 2016

The date for our first Prairie Node meeting has been set!

Thanks to many of you, who have already indicated their interest in attending. We will open up a formal registration process soon. Registration is free for Node members. The meeting will be held in Calgary, at the University of Calgary's **Hotel Alma**.

The Node will cover members' costs for travel, accommodation, and food. *Note*: we will be reserving a block of rooms, so you do not need to book directly with the hotel. If you would like anything other than a standard room, please let us know (you will be required to cover the difference in cost).

## **National CRISM meetings**

On Feb 22, 2016 the CRISM executive groups from each Node met in Monbtreal with CIHR representatives, including Dr. Tony Phillips (Scientific Director, CIHR Institute of Neurosciences, Mental Health and Addiction).

The meeting included presentations from each Node to update the team on regional Node progress, strategic planning for CRISM at the National level, and discussion of network governance. Plans for conducting the CRISM National study (Optimizing patient-centered care: A pragmatic randomized controlled trial comparing models of care in the management of prescription opioid misuse; OPTIMA) were also discussed, including each Node's challenges and readiness for study start up.

Following the CIHR meeting, the OPTIMA regional PIs (Ron Lim and Denise Adams for the Prairie Node) spent 2 days working through details of the OPTIMA trial management and study parameters with regional PIs from across the country.

# Node development funding opportunities

The CRISM Prairie Node will consider ad-hoc requests from Node Members (Investigators

and Knowledge Users) on a rolling basis to provide one-time funding up to \$15,000. Funds are to be used to support research and/or knowledge exchange activities in the area of substance misuse interventions.

## **National CRISM Study**

One of CIHR's requirements for the CRISM Network was for the 4 Nodes to collaborate to complete at least one National-level study. CIHR has approved **OPTIMA**: Optimizing patient centered-care: a pragmatic randomized controlled trial comparing models of care in the management of prescription opioid misuse.

Planning has begun with the identification of Regional PIs within each Node. For the Prairie Node, **Dr. Ron Lim** and **Dr. Denise Adams** will be regional co-PIs for OPTIMA.

We are delighted to welcome the Calgary Opioid Dependency Program (Site Investigator: **Dr. Ron Lim**) and the Edmonton Opioid Dependency Program (Site Investigator: **Dr. Avi Aulakh**) as study sites.

We are doing groundwork to identify additional sites in Saskatchewan and Manitoba.

Other Node Members who have expressed interest in OPTIMA will be brought into discussions as the regional and national OPTIMA teams further develop the study protocol.
