Invitation to Participate: Take Home Naloxone Evaluation

Alberta is experiencing a large increase in fentanyl related deaths. In response to this crisis, the province is taking steps to make the opioid overdose reversal drug, naloxone, available to opioid users across the province through Take Home Naloxone (THN) programs. Alberta Health (AH) and the Alberta Community Council on HIV (ACCH) established THN programs through the partner agencies in ACCH in the summer of 2015. Alberta Health Services (AHS) established a province-wide THN program with kit distribution through over 600 sites: emergency departments; community addiction and mental health clinics; addiction detox and residential services; correctional facilities; and some pharmacies and medical clinics.

At the same time, Health Canada has removed the prescription requirement from Naloxone and AH is working to change provincial regulations so the drug is available behind the counter at pharmacies without a prescription. This change is anticipated to make naloxone more easily accessible and widely available.

Alberta Health, ACCH and AHS have partnered to evaluate THN programs across the province. A provincial evaluation provides the opportunity to assess the impact of large scale distribution of naloxone, compare different models of delivering THN programs, and study the outcome of changing the prescription status of naloxone. It also provides an opportunity to assess how THN programs can contribute to holistic harm reduction
