## NURSING SERVICES

Low barrier nursing services available on a walk-in basis, offering:

- Health education and advice
- Minor treatments, and emergency care.
- Health assessments, testing (HIV and Hepatitis, STI)
- Immunizations (influenza, pneumococcal, Hepatitis A and B)
- Birth control education and advocacy around access.

## PRISON PROGRAM

Assists individuals with criminal justice system involvement, helping them stay safer and healthier, both while incarcerated and after release.

## RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT

Co-created with downtown community members, resulting in 3 videos (two co-developed) and 8 booklets. Topics include first aid and maintaining a healthy pregnancy, while living on the street, and understanding the process of accessing healthcare. These resources are an important component in providing education to the community.

## OUTREACH SERVICES

### Mobile Van Outreach

Operates 7 evenings/week, predominantly in the downtown core.

### On-Foot Outreach

Provides outreach services to clients during the day and also pick up stray needles.

## HARM REDUCTION COUNSELLING & EDUCATION

Provides individuals who are involved in substance use and/or sex work with the skills, knowledge, resources and support, to live safer and healthier lives.

## NEEDLE DISTRIBUTION SITES

13 satellite sites offered in Edmonton in addition to the two primary sites of the Boyle McCauley Health Centre and the Boyle Street Community Services.

## SAFER SUBSTANCE USE / SAFER SEX EDUCATION

## SUPPLIES FOR SAFER SUBSTANCE USE & SAFER SEX

Provides needles, alcohol wipes, condoms, lubrication, tourniquets, pregnancy test kits, sharps containers, Health for Two coupons, feminine hygiene products, first aid and general health supplies and Bad Date Sheets (from Crossroads).

## REFERRALS / SUPPORTIVE SERVICES

Refer to various community supports such as legal services, social services, methadone clinic, STI Clinic, safe houses, mental health services, housing services, and other.

Staff will often go with the clients to the place of referral.

## SPECIAL PROJECTS

- Streetworks is one of the host sites of the provincial network of people who use drugs, **AAWEAR (Alberta Addicts Who Educate and Advocate Responsibly)**.
- **Overdose Prevention Project** Provides Naloxone training and distribution. Initiated in 2005, Streetworks was the first agency in Canada to run a community-based naloxone program.
- **H.E.R. Pregnancy Project (Healthy, Empowered, Resilient)** Provides intensive outreach to street-involved pregnant women who are not accessing prenatal care or receiving less than adequate prenatal care.
- **Youth to Youth - Keeping Kids Safer and Healthier** Outreach to street-involved youth, providing truthful drug education.
